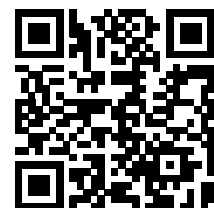

Early American Exploration by England



The Roanoke _____, established in 1587, was one of the first attempts by the English to settle in the New World.
