left	behind was the word "CROATOA	NN" carved into a post. White
believed this meant the	had moved	to Croatoan Island, now known
as Hatteras Island. Despite mult	iple	to find them, the fate of the
Roanoke colonists remains a my	stery to this day.

tribes. Others think they might	have perished due to	or conflict.
