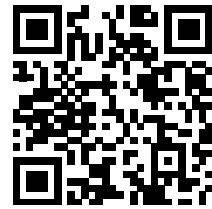

Godspeed and the Jamestown Journey



In 1606, the Godspeed was one of the three _____ that sailed from England to America. This journey was led by Captain Christopher Newport. The Godspeed, along with the Susan _____ and the Discovery, carried settlers to the New World. These settlers hoped to establish the first permanent English _____ in America. They faced many challenges during their voyage across the Atlantic Ocean. Storms and rough seas made the _____ dangerous. Despite these hardships, the settlers remained determined.
