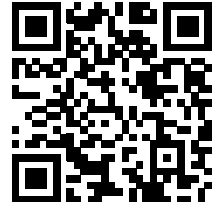


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The 9/11 Attacks



The 9/11 attacks were a _____ of coordinated terrorist actions that struck the United States on September 11, 2001. Four commercial _____ were hijacked by members of the extremist group al-Qaeda.
