The Conspirators of the Gunpowder Plot



The Gunpowder Plot was a conspiracy in 1605 to blow up the English _____ . The main goal was to kill King James I and restore a Catholic monarch to the _____. A group of Catholics, including Guy Fawkes, were involved in this plot. They planned to use _____ to carry out their mission. The plotters hid 36 barrels of gunpowder in a cellar under the House of _____ .

The conspiracy was led by Robert Catesby. He and his followers wanted to end the persecution of _____ in England. They believed that by killing the king and his government, they could bring change. The capture of the plotters led to their execution. They were tried and found guilty of high _____. The Gunpowder Plot had a lasting impact on England. It led to stricter laws against _____ and is remembered every year on November 5th as Guy Fawkes Night.
